### **Quite a Fleet for Jason's Race**

On Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> January at Brisbane Sailing Squadron, fifteen 125's took to the water to compete in the Jason Brewer Memorial Race. At the request of



Doug Brewer, who has been passionately involved with promoting the class for a long time, many of these boats were sailed by a junior sailor from the club, along with an experienced crew-member. Also, some stalwarts of the class made an appearance for the day, and a couple of 16ft skiff sailors even made a cameo appearance as skippers for the race.

The weather definitely made it challenging with 20 knots winds! Many of the junior sailors had never had the opportunity to sail a 125 before so there were a few nerves before the race. However, once on the water the junior sailors found out just how

much fun and how much of a challenge a 125 can be, especially in a blow. There was some stiff competition - with all of the junior sailors used to racing one another it was on for young & old. First place on scratch went to 'Shake n Bake' skippered by young 29er sailor Lachie Robba who made a cameo appearance with his brother Tim. Second place on scratch went to Chris & Bronwyn Anderson in 'Animated Paradox'. Third place was notably taken out by a junior sailor (who also won third place on handicap) Fraser Smith, who sailed with John Anderson in 'Accelerando'. The top handicap placings were all taken out by junior sailors, which is a big achievement and a great testament to their skills & the training provided by the BSS Squids Program. First on handicap was 'Apollo', which was skippered by Lily Geck & crewed by her father Steve. Lily is a junior sailor who is relatively new to 125 sailing but is already showing some huge potential. Only a matter of seconds behind Lily was 'She Waits for No Man' skippered by young sailor Carissa Bridge & crewed by her father Rob. Fraser, who also won third place on scratch, gave the two girls a run for their money and managed to win third place on handicap. A notable mention goes to the boys who came fourth on handicap in the club 125 'Red Sail'. These two boys are both former sabot sailors who have only been sailing 125's for approximately half a season. Very well sailed boys!

Overall a great day was had by all, and there were many smiles to be seen on

### **Gearing up for the State Championships**

This year the 2012 Queensland 125 Championships will be held (as always) at Maryborough Sailing Club in Hervey Bay over the Easter long weekend. Every year the club runs a fantastic event that keeps the sailors coming back – no-one ever wants to even suggest having the States anywhere else! It is a fantastic venue with great sailing conditions and everyone always has a really good time.

Every year the 125 Association runs two divisions at the State Championships. B Fleet is known as the Family Division and is, in my opinion, the most important division at the Championships. B Fleet is an opportunity for people who are new to the class or less experienced to compete in the championships. Boats in B Fleet can sail with three crew members if they wish, swap crews/skippers throughout the championship, and they do not have to use a spinnaker (but can try it out if they wish) and the handicaps are worked out accordingly. This is a great opportunity for new crews to sail their boat in a large regatta. Also, because the B Fleet boats are on the same course as the A Fleet boats, this gives them an opportunity to observe how the more experienced crews are sailing their boats. All of the crews competing in A Fleet are always willing to help the B Fleet boats, both on and off the water. In

previous years the competitors in B Fleet have all had a fabulous time and learnt a lot, and no doubt it will be the same this year.
